ETHICAL ISSUES – WORKING WITH CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

This workshop is intended and designed to acquaint attendees; case worker, direct care workers, teachers, youth care workers, counselors, therapist and licensed professionals with a broad overview of some of the most significant and fundamental issues related to ethical practice in working with children and families. This session will include a discussion of the Code of Ethics as set forth by the National Association of Social Workers and will address issues such as confidentiality, professional boundaries, and self-care. The learning objective of this session, attendees will be able to identify ethical dilemmas in their professional practice, demonstrate evidence of knowledge about the NASW Code of Ethics, apply the NASW Code of Ethics to professional practice, develop a personal-professional model for reflective, ethical decision making.
